# 3 Minute Thesis competition: Rules and Guidelines

The 3 Minute Thesis competition is a worldwide competition were researchers present their work in a quick and easily accessible format. It is a great opportunity to practice your presentation skills as well as gain some perspective on your own research!

The prizes for the winners are yet to be determined.

## Rules for the participants

- Each presentation must be at most three minutes.
- The presentation starts whenever the speaker initiates speaking.
- The participants are only allowed to use slides (i.e. cannot use the whiteboard).
- The decision of the judging panel is final.

We do not put restrictions on the slides but recommend the participants to use between 1 and 5 of them.

### Guidelines

The judging panel will consist of researchers in mathematics but not necessarily from the field of probability. It will assess the speakers based on the following criteria.

#### Comprehension

- Did the speaker provide a background to the research question?
- Was the significance and context of the research clearly explained?
- Did the speaker clearly state the key results of the research?
- Did the speaker follow a clear and logical sequence?

#### Engagement

- Did the oration make the audience want to know more?
- Was the speaker careful not to generalize their research?
- Did the speaker convey enthusiasm for their research?
- Did the speaker capture and maintain their audience's attention?

#### Communication

- Was the presentation adapted to a non-specialist audience of researchers in mathematics (and closely related fields)?
- Did the speaker avoid scientific jargon, explain terminology and provide adequate background information to illustrate points?
- Did the speaker have sufficient vocal range while maintaining a steady pace?
- Did the speaker spend adequate time on each element of their presentation?
- Did the slides enhance the presentation? Were they legible, concise and relevant?
